Costs & application

The camp prize for Germans is 195 Euros per person which includes travelling by "the special scouting train". International guests will have to pay their travel costs to Germany. The final camp prize depends on whether you get on the train with us and mainly which country you come from. We use the jamboree concept to decide on the final prize, meaning scouts from Tunisia, for example, will pay less for the camp than those coming from France as it is simply more expensive to travel to Germany from Tunisia.

We will communicate the final prize to you individually.

There is a large range of possibilities to support your coming. The German government supports scouting and camping activities, especially when international scouts are invited to Germany. Please do not hesitate



to ask about financial aid. We would be happy to provide you with some more information about financial aid and work out a funding plan together.

The application deadline is January 31, 2014. Please inform us about your group's size and age range by then. A more detailed application form will be following within the next few months.
